Higher Education Course - Contemporary Commedia dell'Arte Workshop

Upon completion of the summer session course participants will be awarded a Specialisation Certificate in Commedia dell'Arte.

About the course

Practical and research course using tools for mask work and everything that is defined as Commedia dell'Arte. The aim of the course is to reinvent and rediscover a concrete pragmatics of the actor and professional training by exploring techniques, poetics, visions and suggestions that have captured the creativity and imagination of authors, painters, musicians and directors active between the 19th and the 20th centuries such as Gian Pietro Lucini, Pietro Mascagni, Jacques Copeau, Alexander Blok, Elena Guro, Nikolai Evreinov, Vsevolod Meyerhold, Paul Cézanne, Pablo Picasso, Gino Severini, Ferruccio Busoni, Arnold Schönberg and Igor Stravinsky.

The 2023 summer course will focus on exploring the stock characters of the **Zanni** (Servants), **Vecchi** (Old men), **Capitani** (Captains) and **Innamorati** (Lovers), 17th–20th century theatre texts and on staging dialogues, monologues and sonnets.

At the start of the course, students will receive a complimentary handcrafted leather mask to wear for their interpretation and composition work. At the end of the Higher Education Course: Contemporary Commedia dell'Arte Workshop, there will be an **open class** where students will perform some scenes.

Training techniques: Copeau, Meyerhold, Dullin, Barrault, Feldenkrais, Pagneux.
